Are you eligible for Free School Meals?

Free School Meals can be awarded to children who attend a state maintained school on a full time basis.

In order to be eligible the parent/carer should be in receipt of one of the following:

- ⇒ Income Support
- ⇒ Income Based Jobseekers Allowance
- ⇒ Employment and Support Allowance (IR)
- ⇒ Assisted as an Asylum Seeker under part VI of the Immigration Act 1999
- ⇒ Child Tax Credit **only**, and have an annual income of less than £16,190
- ⇒ The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit.

Please note that if you are in receipt of Working Tax Credits you **will not** be entitled to Free School Meals for your child /children **unless** your entitlement to Working Tax Credit is being paid to you in the four-week period after your employment has ceased or you have started to work less than 16 hours per week. If this is the case then a Free School Meal can be provided for that four-week period once your Tax Credit Decision Notice from HMRC.

Forms are available in the reception to apply for Free School Meals.





Trip Programme Wednesday 7th December

Year 11 – GCSE English Day (Trip In)

What: The students will spend the day rotating around a series of poetry workshops. The day is aimed at preparing the students for their January English Literature exams.

Where: The sessions will be based in the assembly hall and also in the English classrooms on D floor.

Purpose: To equip students with the skills that they will need in order to achieve well on the English Literature poetry exam.

Timings: Normal school timings

Equipment: Basic equipment required.

Clothing: Uniform

Year 10 – Careers and Science Exam Preparation (Trip In)

What: The students will spend the morning in a careers workshop run by outside providers. They will then, from break time onwards undertake a variety of revision based and coursework activities.

Where: In the Academy

Purpose: To develop students understanding of attainment requirements in relation to potential careers. And, to fully prepare students for their GCSE Science examinations and BTEC controlled assessments.

Timings: Normal school timings

Equipment: Basic equipment required.

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Year 9 – PSHE (Trip In)

What: Sex and Relationships

Where: In school-rotating through 7 sessions in classrooms

Purpose: To educate students about STIs and myths surrounding them.

Lunch: Normal school arrangements

Equipment: Normal school equipment

Timings: Normal school timings

Clothing: Normal school uniform

Year 8 – London Science Museum (Trip Out)

Where: Science Museum, South Kensington, Central London

Purpose: To enrich experience of science outside of the classroom/enhance pupil involvement with, and interest in science

Lunch: Packed lunch either from home. The restaurant will be selling food before school that can be taken out.

Equipment: Basic equipment (pen, pencil etc).

Timings: Normal school day (8:45am - 16.00pm)

Clothing: School uniform and a warm coat for travelling.

Year 7 – International Day (Trip In)

What: A day to experience different subjects with an International theme.

Where: In School

Purpose: To engage students with different international themes and to remind them that there is a big world out there, beyond the boundaries of Enfield, England and Europe.

Lunch: In school, same as normal.

Equipment: Pencil case essential.

Timings: Normal school day, except break will be at a slightly different time.

Clothing: Full Academy Uniform





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Year 10 Science GCSE Exam

When:

Students in year 10 have their first science GCSE exam on **12th January** and a **mock science exam in the week beginning 5th December.**

Techniques:

Students have already taken part in a revision trip-in to equip them with the skills they need for their revision. Students should now have started their revision

Students should use a variety of techniques during their revision. They may wish to use:

Mind maps

Revision cards

RAPS

Online tests

Spaced Learning

Art

Flow diagrams

Exams questions

Revision Timetable:

Students have been given a pack that contains a recommended outline of what they should study each day in the lead up to the exam. The timetable allows students one day off from revision per week, it suggests a Sunday. Students could however choose to change their day off to a different day of the week if they wish.

Students should create a timetable to identify the time each day they will spend doing revision.

Resources:

Students may purchase a revision guide and work book from the library to help them with their revision, this is strongly recommended.

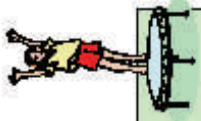

These sessions are play based groups which encourage parents, carers and children to explore new activities together. Children enjoy free play using a range of toys and equipment, a healthy snack, story and song times within the session.

The sessions also provide parents and carers with the opportunity to build social networks.

Through our snack times children learn to sit at the table while they eat, develop good table manners and social skills. They know that they need to have clean hands before their snack is given out, they learn to sit nicely at the table, select their own food from a range of fruit and healthy snacks offered, to eat and drink from their own cups and bowls and to remain at the table until they have finished. The process is even followed by our toddlers who quickly learn and follow the boundaries, enjoying the watching and copying the older children.
