Dear Parents/Carers

The school is buzzing with excitement after our first set of GCSE exam results last week for Maths. Our pass rate of 62 % puts us into the national top 10% of similar schools – and this is before follow-up entries in March and June. 158,000 students across the country sat the exam and the national pass rate was 42%, which shows us just how well we have done. We have noticed a new sense of determination about Year 11 as they can see what is possible given hard work under the direction of our staff. The rest of the school has been given the news as well and we are confident that this will “set the tone” for the years ahead.

We understand that there is a lot of work still to do to in our task of securing a great overall result come the summer and we are by no means complacent. However, we do feel that we are entitled to take encouragement from this result and redouble our efforts to give all 174 in year 11 a great future.

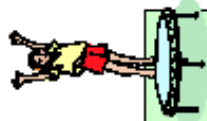

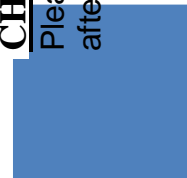

OASIS FAMOUS STAY AND PLAY SESSIONS!

These sessions are play based groups which encourage parents, carers and children to explore new activities together. Children enjoy free play using a range of toys and equipment, a healthy snack, story and song times within the session.

The sessions also provide parents and carers with the opportunity to build social networks.

Through our snack times children learn to sit at the table while they eat, develop good table manners and social skills. They know that they need to have clean hands before their snack is given out, they learn to sit nicely at the table, select their own food from a range of fruit and healthy snacks offered, to eat and drink from their own cups and bowls and to remain at the table until they have finished. The process is even followed by our toddlers who quickly learn and follow the boundaries, enjoying the watching and copying the older children.
