## Message from the Principal

Dear Parents/Carers

We were delighted on Monday night to hear that we received planning permission to convert an office block on Innova Park into our new Sixth Form Suite.

We received our £1.2M government grant last July, but the process of selecting the right building, negotiating the right price and equipping it with all necessary equipment was one that required considerable patience. This week I introduced Year 11 students to the design and the reaction was strongly positive. There are designated “zones” where all students will know the conduct and study pattern expected. At one end of the suite there are 2 large classrooms and private study area where silence must be respected. Close by are a number of small seminar rooms where small groups of students and staff can undertake tutorial sessions. At the other end of the suite is a more informal study space close to a kitchen area and my personal office. Supervision of the students – especially in the early days – will be important for setting the tone of the building and my presence there will be important for establishing its primary purpose as a place for learning.

In the next few weeks we will be fitting the suite out with furniture and fittings. Monday sees a visit from our ICT consultants to ensure that we make the correct purchases of state-of-the-art equipment to support their study. Exciting days indeed as we grow up as an Academy!

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## **YEAR 2 GCSE PE PRACTICAL AND THEORY EXAMINATIONS**

Dear Parent's/Carers and Yr2 GCSE PE Students,  
I can now confirm the final dates for all of your GCSE PE Examinations (including mock exams).

### **Mock GCSE PE Theory Exam**

Will take place in your PE Pathways Lesson (Period 1 and 2) in the week beginning Monday 20<sup>th</sup> February. It will be a past paper covering all topics learnt to date over the last 2 years of the course. Please begin your revision now so that we can accurately identify your strengths and weaknesses over the coming months to help you with your preparation for the final theory exam.

### **Mock GCSE PE Practical Exam**

Will take place on **Monday 27<sup>th</sup> February** and **Wednesday 29<sup>th</sup> February**. You will be assessed in all 4 of your practical sports over this 2 day period. It is essential that if you are ill or injured over this assessment period that you produce a *Doctor's Note/Hospital Letter* to confirm why you are unable to be assessed at this time. If this does not happen then you will fail the GCSE course.

### **Final GCSE PE Theory Exam**

**Wednesday 23<sup>rd</sup> May (PM)**. You will be assessed in all of the theory topics that we have covered over the two year course. The exam lasts for 1h30m and will consist of multiple choice, structured and long answer questions.

### **Final GCSE PE Practical Exam**

**Tuesday 27<sup>th</sup> and Wednesday 28<sup>th</sup> March**. You will be assessed in all 4 of your practical sports over this 2 day period, and an external moderator will come in to assess you in some of your activities. It is essential that if you are ill or injured over this assessment period that you produce a *Doctor's Note/Hospital Letter* to confirm why you are unable to be assessed at this time. If this does not happen then you will fail the GCSE course.

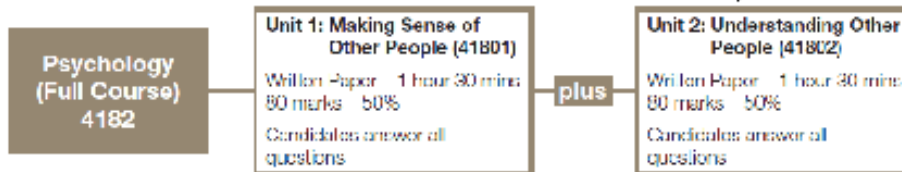

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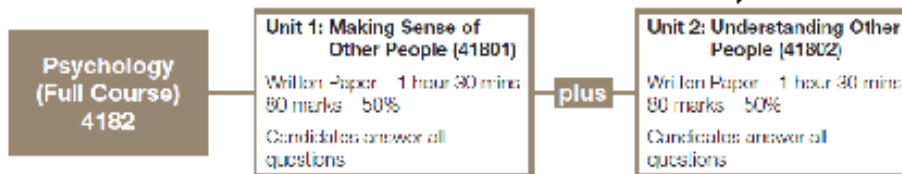

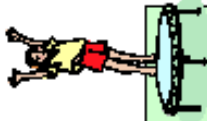
