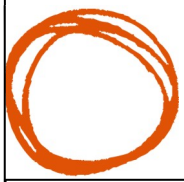
CELEBRATION EVENING—6th JULY

So if you need to buy a new village top from now on you will be directed to some coloured rugby shirts:

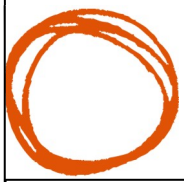
Amethyst – Maroon and Sky Blue

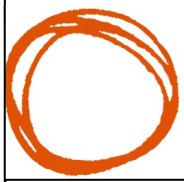
YEAR 9 TRIP OUT TO LONDON

Throughout the day students will take part in a variety of traditional athletics events along with a Learning Family Tug of War Competition. The event will run from 10am until 3:30pm.

This year we are asking Year 8 and 9 students to make their own way down to the track on Sports Day. They will need to arrive at the track in Pickett's Lock between 09:30am-10:15am so that they can be registered and prepare for their morning events. The first events will start at 10:30am prompt, so it is essential that they arrive to the venue on time. The W8 bus service is one form of public transport that they may wish to take if you are unable to drop them off/collect them at the specified time (Chase Farm, Gordon Hill Station, Silver Street, Great Cambridge Road – Church Street, Edmonton Green Station, Pickett's Lock Centre).

All students are asked to arrive at the track in their correct PE kit (polo shirt, shorts, socks and trainers). I would also advise them to bring their Academy Tracksuit if they have one in case the weather is cold. *It is vital that students do come in their kit as their will not be time or space for them to change at the track.* Please ensure that your son/daughter leaves all valuables at home on the day of the event.

Students will be required to bring a packed lunch from home as there are no food outlets at the track. All students must bring a refillable bottle of water to ensure that they remain fully hydrated throughout the day.
