YEAR 9 SPORTS DAY

I have included information below which outlines some possible routes that students could take to get home.

How can I get home from Lee Valley Athletics Track (Pickett's Lock Leisure Centre)?

W8 bus which leaves from outside the track (going towards Edmonton Green and Chace Farm)

You can take the **W8 bus** to **Edmonton Green**. At Edmonton Green you can then get on the **491** or **279 bus** which will bring you back towards Waltham Cross.

You could **walk to Ponders End** along Mollison Avenue (about a 15 minute walk max), to pick up the **491 bus** (Stop PS on LEA VALLEY ROAD).

You could get on a **train** at **Ponders End Train Station**.

Re: Study hall (Monday – Wednesday 4 – 5pm)

As you know, your child has already begun taking GCSE exams and will continue to do so this summer and throughout next year. Whilst attaining 5 A*- C Grades including English and Maths remains the standard to aim for, it is even more important that every student makes good progress during their time at the Academy.

The expectation is that all students should make at least 3 levels progress in English and Maths between the end of Primary school and by the time they take their GCSE exams. This is why our regular Learning Review Days are so important in giving you the opportunity to discuss your child's progress as indicated by the 'on,' 'above' or 'below' judgements.

Our student progress data shows that your child is at risk of not making 3 levels progress. To support them in achieving the results they need, we would like them to attend our new Study Hall which will run every Monday to Wednesday from 4-5pm. At Study Hall students will have access to GCSE exam materials, interactive revision programmes and will be supported by subject specialists and members of the Academy Leadership Team.

It is very important that your child attends these sessions. If there is a revision class running at the same time as Study Hall, your child will need to register at Study Hall before attending the session.

Please support us in ensuring that your child attends these sessions and has every opportunity to fulfil their potential. We will keep you regularly informed about their progress and attendance.
