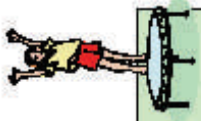

### OASIS STAY AND PLAY SESSIONS

These sessions are play based groups which encourage parents, carers and children to explore new activities together. Children enjoy free play using a range of toys and equipment, a healthy snack, story and song times within the session.

The sessions also provide parents and carers with the opportunity to build social networks.

Through our snack times children learn to sit at the table while they eat, develop good table manners and social skills.

They know that they need to have clean hands before their snack is given out, they learn to sit nicely at the table, select their own food from a range of fruit and healthy snacks

offered, to eat and drink from their own cups and bowls and to remain at the table until they have finished. The process is even followed by our toddlers who quickly learn and follow the boundaries, enjoying watching and copying the older children.
