

ABC Links to literacy

We learn new keywords every lesson, opportunity for reading aloud and learn new information. Communication and written skills explored through debates and assessment/presentation tasks.

AUTUMN - 2

Topic name: FBV

Theme: Citizenship

Why study this topic?

Students will learn about radicalism and peer pressure to discuss the issues of gangs. Using this example, exploring the criminal justice system and the nature of prisons and the purpose of punishment in prisons.

SRPING - 2

Topic name: Healthy relationships

Theme: Love and relationships

Why study this topic?

Students to describe the qualities of health and unhealthy relationships with friends, family and work. Also they will learn about consent in a familial and friendship context. Rights and responsibilities associated with this. Identifying emotions in a relationship and post-break up effectively and explaining the difficulty in a digital era.

SUMMER- 2

Topic name: Drugs

Theme: Self care

Why study this topic?

Students will learn how to identify what drugs are and explaining why drugs are taken. Identifying the difference legal and illegal drugs. Identification of the problems of legal highs and prescription substances. Explain the effects of drugs on the body, in particular, sugar, caffeine and illegal substances.

Statement of intent

Topic name: Inequalities in Britain

Theme: Relationships

Why study this topic?

Students should be able to describe inequalities in society and what laws are in place to prevent damaging in modern Britain .
Students should be able to describe where they can seek support in school and wider society.

SPRING - 1

Topic name: Marriage and the family

Theme: Love and relationships

Why study this topic?

Describing the different types of stable relationships e.g. hetero/homo/reconstituted/blended and discussing the importance for raising children and emotional and domestic labour. Legalities and rights associated with marriage, separation, divorce and cohabitation

SUMMER- 1

Topic name: Study Skills/goals

Theme: Employable me

Why study this topic?

Describing the different types of study, organisational and research skills and what is suited to different types of work/study. Identifying own skills and strengths through online questionnaire of skills and identifying strengths and weaknesses and how these could be used in the workplace
