In MFL we develop literacy through listening, reading, speaking and writing tasks. You also develop your use of different grammatical structures and complex language.

AUTUMN - 2

Topic name: **Healthy living**

Why study this topic?

This unit builds on key vocabulary learnt in Autumn 1 (for example smoking and obesity) to focus on healthy eating and sport. Complexity builds across the half term and applying a range of key tenses in context by the end of the unit.

SPRING - 2

Topic name: **Free time**

Why study this topic?

This unit of free time revises high frequency verbs within this topic whilst also introducing ideas and vocabulary within the topic of technology (seen in Y11). In this unit, you will discuss how they use your phone, and express opinions on TV and music.

SUMMER - 2

Topic name: **Revision**

This final unit of Y10 covers key themes from the GCSE course. This is to ensure that you are excellently prepared for their summer End of Year examinations. You will cover of all four skills within each topic.

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AUTUMN - 1

Topic name: **Social issues**

Why study this topic?

You will learn complex tenses and grammar, including reflexive verbs and si clauses. This unit is designed to revise KS3 vocabulary (family, friends and adjectives) in this new, more challenging context.

Topic name: **Film**

Why study this topic?

This unit is a film study, which incorporates some vocabulary from the free time specification, but also exposes you to contexts and learning beyond the specification.
