AUTUMN – 2
Topic name: **Economic Development**
Why study this topic?
Find out about TNCs and how they have effected developing countries such as Nigeria. What the advantages and disadvantages of their involvement are. Discovering what aid is and what type of aid do developing countries like Nigeria receive and how it is used. What the environmental impacts of rapid development is. How the UK's economy has changed, de-industrialised and what the post industrial economy looks like.

SPRING – 2
Topic name: **Urban Challenges and Issues** -
Why study this topic?
Understanding how urban populations have changed, why this has happened, investigated its impact and how issues and challenges can be counteracted.

SUMMER - 2
Topic name: **Ecosystems**
Why study this topic?
Introducing the definitions, components, links, food chains, nutrient and energy cycles. Discovering small scale ecosystems, characteristics of the worlds 8 major biomes. What its like in the desert, what economic opportunities can be found, how humans have caused desertification and what sustainable practices can be put in place to reduce this.
