Course Outline

Psychology is the scientific study of the human mind and its functions especially those affecting behaviour in a given context.

Key questions explored in A level Psychology:

- What is abnormality?
- Does early childhood attachments affect later adult relationships?
- How reliable is your memory?
- Why do people blindly obey those in authority?
- Are criminals born or made?
- How are children's cognitive abilities different to adults?
